

INCREMENT DISTRICT NO. 2, CITY OF EL RENO

ANNUAL REPORT FOR FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2025

Pursuant to Title 62, Oklahoma Statutes, Sections 850 *et seq.* (the “Local Development Act”), this annual report is being generated to report information to the affecting taxing jurisdictions comprising Increment District No. 2, City of El Reno (the “Increment District”).

The Increment District was created by Ordinance No. 3030 of the City Council of the City of El Reno, Oklahoma (the “City”) dated December 20, 2005 (the “TIF Ordinance”). The TIF Ordinance adopted the Downtown Increment District (the “Project Plan”) for the purpose of encouraging economic development in the City by providing funds to support certain Project Costs identified by the City as necessary to facilitate improvements to the Downtown Area including lighting improvements, sidewalk and accessibility improvements, organizational and administrative cost and contingency cost. Among other things, the Project Plan authorizes the apportionment of tax increment revenues comprised of 100% of the incremental increase in ad valorem tax revenues within the Increment District.

SECTION 1 – Amount and Source of Revenue Captured and Apportioned pursuant to the Project Plan

As of June 30, 2025, the Increment District has generated and City has apportioned (upon receipt from Canadian County, Oklahoma) \$605,184.48 in Ad Valorem Increment Revenues, representing collections beginning January 2008 through the end of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025.

SECTION 2 – Amount and Purposes of Expenditures

As of June 30, 2025, TIF Revenues in the amount of \$726,791.92 have been paid for project cost related to lighting improvements, sidewalk improvements, an organizational and administrative cost.

SECTION 3 – Amount of Principal and Interest Due on Outstanding Bonded Indebtedness

As of June 30, 2025, no bonded indebtedness had been issued related to the Downtown Increment District.

SECTION 4 – Tax Increment Base

The Baseline Assessed Value for the Increment District was determined by the Canadian County Assessor to be \$893,793. The current incremental assessed value of the Increment District as of January 1, 2025, was determined by the Canadian County Assessor to be \$782,005. The current aggregate assessed value of the Increment District as of January 1, 2025, was determined by the Canadian County Assessor to be \$1,676,798.

SECTION 5 – Captured Appraised Value or Other Local Tax or Fee Collections

The captured appraised value of the Increment District as of June 30, 2025, is calculated to be approximately \$93,840.60, representing the incremental assessed value of \$782,005 divided by a

12% assessment rate. The total amount of all Increment Revenues captured and apportioned by the City for fiscal year ended June 30, 2025, is \$89,503.28.

SECTION 6 – Name of Person Currently in Charge of Implementation of the Project Plan

As of June 30, 2025, the person in charge of implementation of the Project Plan is City Manager Mr. Matt Sandidge.

SECTION 7 – Names of Persons who have Disclosed an Interest as required by Section 857 of the Local Development Act.

As of June 30, 2025, no persons have been required to disclose a direct or indirect interest in any property in any project area to be acquired or developed with public financial assistance from the Increment District, as required by Section 857 of the Local Development Act.
