El Reno Launches In-House EMS to Boost Emergency Response

The City of El Reno has officially launched its own in-house Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Department, marking one of the most significant public service advancements in the city's recent history.

Ambulance service is now being provided directly by the City of El Reno. This new EMS department

replaces outsourced providers with a fully city-operated service, improving coordination with first responders and ensuring faster, more consistent emergency care for residents.

The transition reflects months of preparation, planning, and recruitment as the city moves toward greater self-reliance in public

health and safety services. The new department is expected to improve response times, enhance service quality, and allow for closer integration with fire and police operations.

El Reno will add 8 additional EMTs and paramedics to support the department. Interested applicants can apply online

This new initiative represents a major investment in public safety and a strong commitment to the health and well-being of all El Reno residents.

Celebrating Safely in El Reno

For the first time in nearly 20 years, fireworks are now legal in certain parts of El Reno city limits! This applies only to more rural areas of the city, farther from structures and dense neighborhoods. Fireworks are still prohibited within the core of El Reno, but we encourage everyone to enjoy the Fourth of July safely and responsibly. See map and details on fireworks discharge in City Limits.

Utilities Update

We recently opened bids for the W. Jensen Road waterline project, which will stretch from Liberty Energy to Reformatory Road. This is a major infrastructure improvement that will increase water capacity south of I-40, improve pressure and volume in the Holbrook Addition, and support future growth in the area. Several good bids were submitted, and City Council will consider awarding the contract at its next meeting on July 8. Funding for this project includes the final allocation of our ARPA funds.

Work is also progressing well on the Foreman and Keith waterline replacement. Crews are making steady progress and expect to wrap up soon.

Later this month, your utility bill will reflect a rate adjustment due to the new solid waste contract (\$2 per month). This includes an increase in the trash rate and the addition of twice-annual curbside bulk pickup service.


Another adjustment — this time to your sewer rate — will appear on your August bill (due in September). This annual recalculation is based on your average water usage during the winter months of December, January, and February.

El Reno Fiber

Fiber expansion continues! We're seeing a steady stream of new customers joining the system, and several additional areas will be coming online soon — including Barker, Macomb, Hoff, and Williams, as well as the Lynn Drive and North Boynton area north of Foreman.

Remember: El Reno Fiber is a city-operated service, with local tech support and customer service you can count on. That's a major difference compared to other providers. And most importantly — the service is very, very good.

- South: Reno Avenue
- West: N2790 Road / N Fort Reno Road / S Chiles Road
- North: 164th St NW / Hefner Road
- East: Gregory Road

► Summary: El Reno Fireworks Ordinance No. 9368

► Legal Discharge Dates & Times:

- June 27–July 4: 2:00 PM – 10:00 PM
- July 4 (any day): Noon – 11:00 PM
- July 5 (if Friday or Saturday): Noon – 10:00 PM
- All other times (July 5–June 26): Prohibited

► Fireworks Are Banned within 500 feet of:

- Churches
- Hospitals
- Schools
- Unharvested crops
- Firework sales or storage locations

► Fireworks Are Banned within 200 feet of:

- Industrial buildings or yards (including oil & gas sites)

► Fireworks Are Banned in:

- Residential subdivisions with fewer than 1-acre lots
- RV/mobile home subdivisions

► Specific zone entirely banned:

- North of Jensen Road
- East of Reformatory Road
- South of the North Canadian River
- West of Radio Road

► Safety & Conduct Rules:

- Must be discharged on a noncombustible surface, at least 25 ft from permanent structures
- No fireworks on city/county parks, highways, or within 15 ft of any street
- Fireworks cannot be discharged from a motor vehicle
- All debris must be cleaned up by the next day
- Adult supervision required for anyone under 16
- Fireworks may only be used on owned or permitted property
- Fireworks are prohibited during burn bans or when restricted by the Fire Marshal.
