Downtown & Route 66 Reinvestment Expands

The City of El Reno continues to build momentum in downtown and Route 66 reinvestment. City Council recently approved an additional **\$20,000 in matching grant funds** for commercial property improvements, bringing the program total to **\$95,000**.

This program was originally made possible

through revenue generated from the filming of *Twisters*, which the Council committed entirely to reinvesting in the areas most impacted by production. Matching funds are available on a **60/40** basis for businesses located downtown and along Route 66 from Alfadale Road to Reformatory Road.

Eligible projects include

façade upgrades, signage improvements, window replacement, painting, and more. The program has already proven to be very popular with local property owners, and this additional funding ensures continued opportunities for investment in the heart of our community.



UPDATES


The Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) continues to make great progress on several key projects in our community. Work on the roundabout is moving forward with new signage, striping, and the centerpiece monument coming together. Once complete, this project will provide both a functional and attractive gateway into El Reno.

ODOT crews are also hard at work on South US 81, replacing concrete panels. When finished, the approach into town and the connection to the roundabout will create a much smoother and more welcoming entrance for residents and visitors alike. While these improvements do bring some temporary

traffic disruptions, the long-term benefits will far outweigh the short-term inconvenience.

Looking ahead, ODOT will begin a mill and overlay project extending from Elm Street to Caddo Street along Rock Island Avenue, Wade Street, and Choctaw Avenue. This work will also continue down Sunset Drive to Hadden Avenue, improving the surface and extending the life of these highly traveled corridors.

We truly value our partnership with ODOT. By working together, we are able to accomplish more for El Reno than either could achieve alone. These projects represent not only an investment in our infrastructure, but also a commitment to improving the quality of life for our



residents and visitors.

In addition, our partnership with Canadian County continues to bring positive momentum to local road improvements. Upcoming work in the Manning, Wilshire, and

Britton area will address critical needs and improve connectivity for our growing community. We appreciate the strong collaboration with the County, which allows us to move forward on these much-needed projects.

Community DEVELOPMENTS

Community Breaks Ground on Animal Shelter Dog Yard Remodel

Despite the rain and mud, a strong crowd gathered Sept. 2 as the El Reno City Council joined City staff, Friends of the El Reno Animal Shelter, and community members to break ground on much needed improvements to the Animal Shelter's dog yard. Council Member Amy Neathery delivered remarks before the group turned shovels for the project.

The \$16,000 remodel will level the 1,400-square-foot yard,

add a retaining wall, and install turf designed for K-9 use—improving drainage, reducing mud, and creating a safe, comfortable play space for the dogs. Thanks to El Reno High School Smash Week 2025 students, Friends of the Shelter, and City crews, this project showcases how community partnerships can deliver lasting improvements. Construction is expected to wrap up Sept. 12, with a ribbon-cutting celebration to follow.

Sunset Trail Expansion Moving Forward

The City of El Reno continues to make progress on expanding recreational trails for our community.

Phase 1 (solid red line) has been completed, giving residents and visitors an accessible space to walk, run, and enjoy the outdoors.

Phase 2 (dashed red line) is currently in the design phase and will soon move into construction.

Phase 3 (dashed blue line) recently received grant funding and will follow in the near future.

Possible Phase 4 (dashed yellow line) is where future trails may be considered.

Each phase of the project has been awarded approximately \$300,000 through the Recreational Trails Program, a grant administered by the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department. This program operates as an 80/20 match grant, meaning the City contributes 20% while 80% is

covered through grant funding.

These investments not only improve quality of life in El Reno but also

strengthen our city's commitment to outdoor recreation, connectivity, and long-term community growth.



Free Dump Days, Townwide Garage Sale, and Return of Curbside Bulk Collection

The City of El Reno is helping residents get ready for fall clean-up with Free Bulk Dump Days, the Townwide Garage Sale, and the return of curbside bulk waste collection.

Sept. 1–14, 2025 — Free Bulk Dump Days (Canadian County Landfill)

Proof of residency is required. To avoid confusion, please note:

- Electronic water bills: An emailed/electronic copy of your current water bill is accepted with matching photo ID.
- Authorized dumping for non-account holders: If the bill is in a landlord's name or a homebound resident hires a hauler, the authorized person may dump with a copy of the bill (electronic or printed) and a photo of the resident's driver's license or state ID.
- Past-due balances: Account status does not affect eligibility during Free Bulk Dump Days; a current, dated bill is required.

Oct. 24–26, 2025 — Townwide Garage Sale

List your garage sale free of charge to be included on the El Reno Tribune map. Call 405-262-5180 or email citygaragesale@elrenotribune.com.

Nov.–Dec. 2025 — Curbside Bulk Waste Collection (One Pass Per Street)

Items must be at the curb by 7 a.m. on your scheduled day. Crews make only one pass per street and will not assist in moving debris.

Residents may begin placing items curbside one week prior to their pick-up date and should stack items in an orderly fashion. Keep personal property (e.g., portable basketball goals) away from the curb to avoid accidental removal.

- **Nov. 1 — Monday trash route**
- **Nov. 8 — Tuesday trash route**
- **Nov. 15 — Wednesday trash route**
- **Nov. 22 — Thursday trash route**
- **Dec. 1 — Friday trash route**

Important Regulations

Debris not meeting these requirements will not be collected, and no notification will be provided:

1. Refrigerators, freezers and air conditioners accepted only if freon has been properly removed and certification is attached.
2. Brush, tree limbs, lumber, decking, fence panels, etc., must be cut to 4 feet or shorter and bundled with rope or cord.
3. Flooring (any type) must be bundled in 4'x4' sections and tied.

4. No concrete, rocks or bricks.
 5. No construction or demolition materials.
 6. No hazardous waste: batteries, paints, tires, oils or other hazardous liquids.
 7. No dead animals.
 8. No large tree stumps — must be cut to 4' length x 12" diameter.
 9. Jacuzzis, pools, etc., must be cut to 4'x4' pieces.
 10. Small loose materials must be placed in containers.
 11. Empty cardboard boxes must be flattened/broken down.
- Dec. 1–14, 2025 — Quarterly Bulk Dump Days** (Canadian County Landfill)
- To wrap up the fall clean-up season, residents may take advantage of the Quarterly Bulk Dump Days from Dec. 1–14, 2025 at the Canadian County Landfill. The same proof of residency rules apply as in September.

GOOD TO DUMP

- Refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, tube tvs, etc.
- Brush, tree limbs, lumber, decking, fence panels, etc.
- Flooring of any kind must be in 4'x4' bundles and tied
- Jacuzzi's, pools, etc. must be cut into 4'x4' pieces
- Tree stumps must be cut to 4' length and no larger than 12" diameter

DO NOT DUMP

- No pieces of concrete, rocks or bricks
- No construction or demolition materials
- No hazardous waste materials: batteries, paints, tires, oils, or hazardous liquid substances
- No Dead Animals

New Septic Dump Station Relocated Near RV Park

The City of El Reno has completed the relocation of its septic dump station to better serve residents and visitors.

The previous dump station, located in Adams Park near Country Club, had become problematic in recent years. Septic haulers were using the site instead of the wastewater treatment facility where they are permitted, leading to repeated stoppages, overflows, and unsightly conditions.

The new station is now located on the west side of the RV Park, conveniently near the restrooms. While the site has

not yet been formally marked, it is on this month's City Council agenda for final approval of the user fee.

If approved, the service will be clearly signed, with a fee of \$10 per use, payable at the RV office. Operating hours will follow the RV Park schedule: 6 a.m. to 11 p.m. daily.

This relocation improves functionality, reduces misuse, and enhances the overall appearance of Adams Park while continuing to provide an important service for RV travelers.


