Demolition Wraps at Future "Hub" Site



The City of El Reno has nearly completed demolition at the corner of Sunset and Choctaw, paving the way for the next phase of its Route 66 revitalization. The future El Reno "Hub" will expand downtown parking and create a new community gathering space along Route 66.

The aging structures had become a safety concern, making demolition a necessary first step toward redevelopment. The site has also been accepted into the Oklahoma Corporation Commission's Brownfield Program—the 100th property to be enrolled—ensuring proper environmental assessments and cleanup before construction begins.

City officials say the success of the Filling Station Visitor Center has underscored the need for more parking, safer pedestrian crossings, and new amenities to support the growing number of travelers and community events.

When complete, the El Reno "Hub" will feature expanded parking, wayfinding signage, native landscaping, sidewalks, and a Route 66 mural, blending nostalgia with modern improvements. The site will also serve as the future home of the Twisters Trolley, a key prop from the 2024 movie Twisters, adding another unique Route 66 attraction to downtown El Reno.

The City is applying for a Route 66 Commission grant to help bring this exciting project to life.



Streets UPDATES

Roadwork Advancing Throughout El Reno

Roadway improvements are moving forward across the community. Chip and seal work is underway at Jones Road and N Shepard Avenue through our partnership with Canadian County. The Oklahoma Department of Transportation is also making significant progress on Rock Island from Elm Street to E Wade Street, Wade Street to S Choctaw

Avenue, and from S Choctaw Avenue to N Choctaw Avenue at Caddo Street. In addition, ODOT is working along Sunset Avenue, better known as Route 66, from S Choctaw Avenue to S Hadden Avenue. We're excited to see these important projects coming together and are grateful for the partnerships making them possible.

A few outstanding items remain before the building permit can be issued, but we are working closely with the Waffle House team to get the project underway soon.




Code Updates

Development Services continues to update building codes to ensure the highest safety and quality standards for our residents and business owners.

Recently, City Council approved an amendment requiring emergency electrical disconnects- a significant safety achievement.

Looking ahead, we are bringing an ordinance to Council in October that will prohibit the use of copper-clad and other bi-metal wiring. This initiative is the result of close collaboration with Trent Bryan, Fire Marshal, who has provided valuable data and insights from fire professionals across the region.

Townwide Garage Sale and Curbside Bulk Collection Make Their Return

The City of El Reno is helping residents get ready for fall clean-up with Free Bulk Dump Days, the Townwide Garage Sale, and the return of curbside bulk waste collection.

Oct. 24-26, 2025 — Townwide Garage Sale

List your garage sale free of charge to be included on the El Reno Tribune map. Call 405-262-5180 or email citygaragesale@elrenotribune.com.

Nov.-Dec. 2025 — Curbside Bulk Waste Collection (One Pass Per Street)

Items must be at the curb by 7 a.m. on your scheduled day. Crews make only one pass per street and will not assist in moving debris.

Residents may begin placing items curbside one week prior to their pick-up date and should stack items in an orderly fashion. Keep personal property (e.g., portable basketball goals) away from the curb to avoid accidental removal.

Important Regulations

Debris not meeting these requirements will not be collected, and no notification will be provided:

1. Refrigerators, freezers and air conditioners accepted only if freon has been properly removed and certification is attached.

2. Brush, tree limbs, lumber, decking, fence panels, etc., must be cut to 4 feet or shorter and bundled with rope or cord.

3. Flooring (any type) must be bundled in 4'x4' sections and tied.

4. No concrete, rocks or bricks.

5. No construction or demolition materials.

6. No hazardous waste: batteries, paints, tires, oils or other hazardous liquids.

7. No dead animals.

8. No large tree stumps — must be cut to 4' length x 12" diameter.
9. Jacuzzis, pools, etc., must be cut to 4'x4' pieces.
10. Small loose materials must be placed in containers.
11. Empty cardboard boxes must be flattened/broken down.

Dec. 1-14, 2025 — Quarterly Bulk Dump Days (Canadian County Landfill)

To wrap up the fall clean-up season, residents may take advantage of the Quarterly Bulk Dump Days from Dec. 1-14, 2025 at the Canadian County Landfill. The same proof of residency rules apply as in September.


