Streets DEVELOPMENTS

Streets & Public Works —Monthly Snapshot

As crews continue working across the city, Public Works wrapped up another high-output month focused on pavement repairs, drainage fixes, material hauling, mowing, and sign safety. Here's a fast breakdown of where equipment rolled, rock landed, and improvements were made across El Reno this month:

Roads & Repairs

- Potholes repaired across Foreman, Boynton, 27th, Wilson, and Hwy 81
- 400 tons of rock installed on Airport Rd/22nd (Darlington to Memorial)
- Blade patching at Mill Ridge & Boynton **Street Maintenance**

- Sweeping in Ridgecrest and Downtown
- Debris cleared at Sheppard & Golf Course Dr. drains

Signage & Safety

- Stop signs replaced at Fort Reno/Darlington + Woodson/Keith
- Speed limit sign repaired + low branches trimmed at Hoff

Animal Shelter Construction

- Grading, excavation, fencing restoration
- Footings poured + stem wall excavation & steel tied

Materials & Hauling

- Delivered 100+ tons of rock/asphalt/millings to Country Club, Sheppard, Jones & Boynton

Grading

- Regular grading across north/NW/NE zones + Country Club corridor

Traffic Checks

- Malfunctioning light reports at Hwy 81/10th & Elm/Rock Island — both functioning properly

Drainage

- Replaced storm drain at Country Club and Sunset
- Identified failed -275' galvanized drain at Golf Course Dr/Magnolia
- Cleared clogged French drain (suspected fiber contractor damage)

Special Projects

- City Hall lot blocked for work
- Alfadale guard rail sourced/repaired

Two El Reno Bridges Approved for Full-Funded Federal Replacement

El Reno has been awarded federal funding—administered by ODOT through the Bridge Formula Program (BFP)—to replace/rehabilitate two local bridge structures.

This program provides 100% federal funding and no local match is required.

The two bridges included are:

- **Banner Road — south of Wilshire**
- **Alfadale Road — south of U.S. Route 66**

These improvements will enhance safety, drivability, and long-term infrastructure reliability along key commuter and farm-to-market corridors.

Project design and coordination with ODOT will begin soon. The City will share construction timelines and traffic details as the process moves forward.

El Reno Carnegie Library to Receive \$10,000 Gift from Carnegie Corporation of New York

The El Reno Carnegie Library has been selected to receive a \$10,000 gift from Carnegie Corporation of New York, the foundation established by Andrew Carnegie. The award is part of Carnegie Libraries 250—a national initiative recognizing the upcoming 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence, and honoring the approximately 1,280 Carnegie Libraries still serving their communities today.


Between 1886 and 1917, Scottish immigrant Andrew Carnegie funded the construction of 1,681 free public libraries across the United States. Roughly 750 are still in their original buildings, including ours. Built in 1905, the El Reno Carnegie Library is one of only 25 original Carnegie Libraries in Oklahoma.

"This gift not only helps continue to support our library's work in the

community, but it serves as a reminder of the rich history and our important connection to Carnegie Libraries across the country," said Library Director Bridget Scheffler.

"Our founder, Andrew Carnegie, who championed the free public library movement of the late 19th century, described libraries as 'cradles of democracy' that strengthen the democratic idea, the equality of the citizen, and the royalty of man," said Dame Louise Richardson, president of Carnegie and former head of the University of Oxford. "We still believe this and are delighted to celebrate our connection to the libraries he founded."

The El Reno Carnegie Library will receive the funds in January 2026 and may use the gift at its discretion to celebrate the 250th anniversary, advance its mission, and benefit the community.

Curbside Bulk Collection is this Saturday for Wednesday Trash Routes

Curbside Bulk Waste Collection Continues (One Pass Per Street)

Items must be at the curb by 7 a.m. on your scheduled day. Crews make only one pass per street and will not assist in moving debris. Residents may begin placing items curbside one week prior to their pick-up date and should stack items in an orderly fashion. Keep personal property (e.g., portable basketball goals) away from the curb to avoid accidental removal.

• **Nov. 15 — Wednesday trash route**

• **Nov. 22 — Thursday trash route**

• **Dec. 1 — Friday trash route** *Important Regulations*

Debris not meeting these requirements will not be collected, and no notification will be provided:

1. Refrigerators, freezers and air conditioners accepted only if freon has been properly removed and certification is attached.
2. Brush, tree limbs, lumber, decking, fence panels, etc., must be cut to 4 feet or shorter and bundled with rope or cord.
3. Flooring (any type) must be bundled in 4'×4' sections and tied.
4. No concrete, rocks or bricks.
5. No construction or demolition materials.
6. No hazardous waste: batteries, paints, tires, oils or other hazardous liquids.
7. No dead animals.
8. No large tree stumps — must be cut to 4' length × 12" diameter.
9. Jacuzzis, pools, etc., must be cut to 4'×4' pieces.
10. Small loose materials must be placed in containers.
11. Empty cardboard boxes must be flattened/broken down.

Dec. 1–14, 2025 — Quarterly Bulk Dump Days (Canadian County Landfill)

To wrap up the fall clean-up season, residents may take advantage of the **Quarterly Bulk Dump Days** from Dec. 1–14, 2025 at the Canadian County Landfill. Proof of residency required.



- **Nov. 15 - Wednesday trash route**
- **Nov. 22 - Thursday trash route**
- **Dec. 6 - Friday trash route**

THIS Saturday - 7a.m.
for the Wednesday trash route.


Crimson Creek Golf Course
