

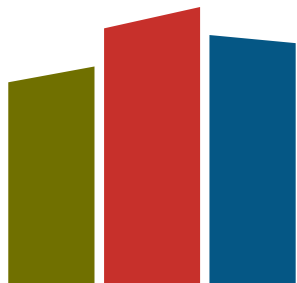

US 81 & Route 66 Overlay

Residents have likely noticed the improvements along US 81 and Route 66. The overlay has already made a meaningful difference in both appearance and drivability. Crews still have a few items to complete—such as drainage inlet work, new striping, and a handful of finishing touches—but the project is nearing completion. Thank you for your continued patience as we wrap up these final steps.

Bulk pickup will resume in the spring, and residents can continue using the dump quarterly during the first two weeks of each quarter. We appreciate everyone doing their part to keep El Reno clean and well maintained.

DEVELOPMENT UPDATES



Seven Brew Coffee – S. Country Club Road

Seven Brew is moving forward with plans to construct a new coffee shop at the former Pizza Hut location on S. Country Club Road. This project represents another positive step for the corridor, adding new energy to an area that continues to see steady investment. Once complete, it will provide residents with a drive-through coffee option in a high-traffic portion of town. We look forward to seeing this project take shape in the coming months.

Waffle House – S. Country Club Road

Waffle House has approved plans and continues working through the site development process for its future location on S. Country Club Road. While several development milestones remain, the project is progressing, and we will share additional updates as construction moves forward. Its arrival will bring another well-known brand to El Reno and add a 24-hour dining option that many residents have been eager to see return.

Dog House – 1402 S. Choctaw Avenue

The Dog House, located at 1402 S. Choctaw Avenue, will be opening soon just south of Tooters. This new sports-bar-style restaurant will offer a relaxed atmosphere and a menu centered around quality hotdogs and casual favorites. It's a welcome addition to the Choctaw corridor and will provide another local dining option for both residents and visitors!

Brakes Plus – S. Country Club Road

Brakes Plus has received its permit and continues moving ahead with development along S. Country Club Road. The project reflects continued confidence in El Reno's growth and will expand the automotive service options available to our community. This addition complements other development in the area and strengthens this corridor's role as a major service and retail hub.

Taco Mayo – 1633 Highway 66

Taco Mayo has made significant progress on reconstruction at 1633 Highway 66, and the project continues to move quickly. With visible improvements taking shape, it won't be long before residents are able to enjoy this longtime favorite again. We're pleased to see the investment being made to modernize and refresh the location.



Old Canadian County Courthouse Demolished to Make Way for New Facility

The old Canadian County Courthouse on Choctaw Avenue has officially been demolished, clearing the way for construction of a new, modern four-story courthouse. The new 112,000-square-foot facility will consolidate most county and court services under one roof, improving access and efficiency for residents.



Construction is now moving forward, with the new courthouse expected to open in 2027. The project reflects the county's continued growth and commitment to updating essential public infrastructure.

Curbside Bulk Collection is this Saturday for Friday Trash Routes

Curbside Bulk Waste Collection Continues (One Pass Per Street)

Items must be at the curb by 7 a.m. on your scheduled day. Crews make only one pass per street and will not assist in moving debris. Residents may begin placing items curbside one week prior to their pick-up date and should stack items in an orderly fashion. Keep personal property (e.g., portable basketball goals) away from the curb to avoid accidental removal.

• Dec. 6 — Friday trash route *Important Regulations*

Debris not meeting these requirements will not be collected, and no notification will be provided:

1. Refrigerators, freezers and air conditioners accepted only if freon has been properly removed and certification is attached.
2. Brush, tree limbs, lumber, decking, fence panels, etc., must be cut to 4 feet or shorter and bundled with rope or cord.
3. Flooring (any type) must be bundled in 4'x4' sections and tied.
4. No concrete, rocks or bricks.
5. No construction or demolition materials.
6. No hazardous waste: batteries, paints, tires, oils or other hazardous liquids.
7. No dead animals.
8. No large tree stumps — must be cut to 4' length x 12" diameter.
9. Jacuzzis, pools, etc., must be cut to 4'x4' pieces.
10. Small loose materials must be placed in containers.
11. Empty cardboard boxes must be flattened/broken down.

Dec. 1–14, 2025 — Quarterly Bulk Dump Days (Canadian County Landfill)

To wrap up the fall clean-up season, residents may take advantage of the **Quarterly Bulk Dump Days** from Dec. 1–13, 2025 at the Canadian County Landfill. Proof of residency required.

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS INCLUDE:

Furniture, fence panels cut into 4-foot sections and securely bundled, appliances with a sticker verifying freon removal by a certified appliance technician, carpet cut into 4-foot rolls, and yard waste or tree limbs not exceeding 4 feet in length, 12 inches in diameter, and bundled. Cardboard boxes should be broken down and stacked, and small loose materials must be placed in containers.

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS INCLUDE:


Roofing shingles, concrete, brick, rock, dirt, paint or other hazardous chemicals, tires, building material from remodeling and auto parts.
NO DEAD ANIMALS.
No polycarts will be emptied on these days.

Keep trash away from basketball goals, polycarts, utility meters, parked cars, etc.
