DOWNTOWN HIGHLIGHTS

The City of El Reno is systematically reactivating long-vacant downtown areas. Utilizing funding sources like the Oklahoma Route 66 Commission Grant, we are transforming the intersection of Route 66 and U.S. 81 at Sunset Drive and South Choctaw Avenue into a vibrant hub for residents and tourists. This area, including Petree Plaza and Mother Road Plaza, will soon feature the Filling Station (\$1.2 million received in grant funding). We are pursuing additional grant funding to create the Mobility Hub, providing a welcoming space for tour buses, caravans, and travelers. By attracting more visitors, this initiative will boost downtown exposure, support downtown commerce, and generate additional sales tax revenue as tourists shop at local businesses.

At the corner of South Rock Island Avenue and East Wade Street, the City has received brownfields grant funding from the Oklahoma Corporation Commission to remove the fuel tanks and canopy from the long-abandoned gas station at 300 South Rock Island Avenue. Previously owned by an absentee landlord, the City acquired the site to reactivate it and eventually lease it out to a business. The project will eliminate potential environmental hazards, stimulate economic growth by attracting new businesses, and increase property values. These efforts will create a more attractive and vibrant downtown for residents and visitors alike.

STREETS DEPARTMENT

The resurfacing of Reformatory Road is now complete, thanks to a successful partnership with Canadian County. This collaboration allowed us to extend the chip and seal project further down West Elm Street and along the south side of Lake El Reno near the RC Airpark. Additionally, the storm drain repair on South Country Club Road is still going strong, as contractors work quickly to open all lanes of traffic again.

UTILITIES DEPARTMENT

The City of El Reno water utility is an enterprise fund, meaning the cost of our water operations is funded solely by rates, with no tax dollars used for water services. Like other businesses, our costs have been rising. We strive to operate our water utility as efficiently as possible. The majority of our employees live here, too, so we understand the impact a rate increase has on families and individuals. However, when our operational costs continue to increase, we must raise the rates to provide critical services for the community and to stay current with necessary improvements to our aging infrastructure.

- South Mitchell Avenue
- East Elm Street (Donald Avenue to Shepherd Avenue)
- Foreman Road (Keith Avenue to Sunset Drive)
- East Jenkins Street (Mitchell Avenue to Donald Avenue)

These upcoming projects ensure year-round water availability through ongoing maintenance and upgrades to our infrastructure. By investing in these improvements, we enhance service reliability, water quality, and sustainability, meeting growing demands and regulatory standards for the benefit of all residents and businesses in El Reno. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

We are experiencing a busy construction season, with 21 new home permits issued in June—the highest number this year! Additionally, we issued 5 new commercial permits this year. This growth is a source of pride for our city. See the table below for details.

The Shed Bar & Grill, which opened in June, has brought additional energy to the 81 corridor, creating more activity and excitement in the area. Whataburger has been permitted, but has not started construction yet. It will be on South Country Club Road next to Burger King.

An iconic mural in downtown El Reno is set to receive a facelift. The “Crossroads of America” mural, painted by artist Chris Small, is a favorite subject for photographs by both locals and tourists. Chris Small will begin refreshing the mural's colors soon, restoring its vibrancy.
