


EL RENO Insights

El Reno Fire Department Enhances Rescue Capabilities with New Stokes Basket

The El Reno Fire Department has recently added a new Stokes basket to its rescue equipment, enhancing the department's ability to respond to emergencies requiring patient extrication. This specialized rescue stretcher is designed for transporting injured individuals across difficult terrain, such as steep inclines, collapsed structures, or areas with limited access.

A Stokes basket is a critical tool in emergency response,

particularly for situations like vehicle accidents in ravines, water rescues, and incidents in industrial or agricultural settings. The durable metal frame and secure strapping system ensure that patients remain stable during transport, minimizing movement that could worsen injuries.

"This addition to our equipment will improve our ability to safely and efficiently move patients in challenging



rescue situations," said Fire Chief Jason Duff. "Our firefighters train extensively for these scenarios, and

having the right tools can make all the difference in saving lives."

Ensuring the safety and well-being of our community remains a top priority for the City of El Reno. Our Police Department is actively training new recruits, equipping them with the skills and knowledge needed to serve and protect our residents. This continuous effort to strengthen our force helps maintain a safe and secure environment for everyone.

Meanwhile, our Animal Control team has been working diligently to address cases of neglected horses in newly annexed areas. As our city expands, we are committed to ensuring that all animals receive proper care and attention. These efforts not only protect animal welfare but also contribute to public safety and community responsibility.

In addition, high winds have significantly increased fire dangers throughout the region. Dry, dead grasses continue to pose a major risk. These hazardous conditions will persist. We strongly encourage residents to stay alert, take necessary precautions, and follow fire safety guidelines to help prevent potential wildfires.

We appreciate the ongoing support and cooperation of our residents as we work together to keep El Reno safe. If you see any concerning situations related to public safety or animal welfare, please report them to the appropriate city departments.



The drainage project on South Country Club Road, just north of Elm Street, is progressing as planned. In addition, we are continuing work on several other important initiatives, including culvert replacements, daily grading of rural roads, and sidewalk repairs along Sunset Drive, Crimson Lake Addition, and Country Club Road. We're also installing original Route 66 alignment signs and making improvements to striping and signage along Babcock.



City Council to Review New Water/Wastewater Plant Operator; Significant Progress on Waterline Projects Underway

The City Council will soon evaluate the selection of a new operator for the water and wastewater plants. Meanwhile, our waterline contractor has made significant strides on the Radio Road bore project, which will enhance the system by creating a crucial loop. Additionally, work is progressing on the Jensen Road and US 81 segments of the waterline extension.

COMMUNITY Development



As of March 2025, new Braum's and Casey's General Store locations are under construction along Highway 81 in El Reno, Oklahoma, aiming to enhance local dining and convenience options. **Braum's Ice Cream & Dairy Store:** Braum's is constructing a new store on Highway

81 in El Reno to better serve the community. The project involves building a 6,067-square-foot facility with a construction value of \$800,000. The store will feature a full-service food and drink component, along with a grocery mart. Construction is underway by Wattsco of



Oklahoma Co. of El Reno, and the new store is anticipated to open sometime in the summer of 2025.

Casey's General Store: Casey's General Store is also constructing a new location on HWY 81 off I-40 in El Reno. This development aims to enhance the

convenience and services available to the local community. While specific details about the store's features and expected opening date have not been publicly announced, interested individuals can visit Casey's official website for updates.

AIRPORT EXPANSION TAKES OFF



At the airport, Tony Caldwell has started renovations on Hangar 3, and WL McNatt will soon begin work on the new airport terminal. Our engineers are also finalizing

plans for a new box hangar. Meanwhile, our airport crew is staying busy with routine maintenance and fuel sales, with an increase in travelers coming through.
